"A" ENTRIES

- NSWGFA CLUBS are invited to nominate TEAMS of 3 boats, each of which MUST be registered and compliant with all NSW Roads and Maritime Services (NSWRMS) safety equipment requirements with that Member Club. (Minimum of 2 boats will constitute a team)
- 2. **NSWGFA** reserves the right to refuse entry to the Tournament.
- 3. ANGLERS entering the 2021 NSWGFA Interclub Tournament MUST be full financial members (or Life Members) of a Club affiliated with NSWGFA. For this tournament, an angler is a financial club member from the date of receipt of their completed Membership Application form and dues by his/her Club Executive. The Boat Captain and all crew involved in the capture or the tag and release (anglers, boat skippers, wire/trace man, gaffer or tagger) of a fish must be registered on the entry form.
- 4. ENTRY FEES There is an entry fee of \$150.00 (incl. GST) for each boat under 8 metres and a minimum entry fee of \$250.00 (incl. GST) for each boat 8 metres and over. Completed entry forms together with proof of insurance as stated in Rule "A" 5 and fees MUST be forwarded to your CLUB SECRETARY by 14th January 2021. Incomplete entry forms will be rejected, full team list and entries must be received by 31st January from your club secretary, strictly no entries will be accepted after this date.
- 5. LATE FEE No late fee as we will not accept entries after 31st January 2021.
- **6. INSURANCE** each vessel is to have their own Third-Party Liability Insurance and Boat Owner MUST provide details of insurance covering third party property liability and third-party personal liability insurance on the *Boat Safety Rescue form*.
- 7. REFUND Tournament entry fee will be refunded if the event is cancelled in your area due to Gail Warning.

"B" TOURNAMENT RULES

- 1. THE TOURNAMENT COMMITTEE to conduct the competition shall comprise of the NSWGFA Executive.
- 2. MISCONDUCT the Tournament Committee may on its own initiative investigate and act upon any incident of misconduct by any person on a boat, be he/she registered for the tournament or not occurring during the tournament. The Committee may impose penalties of loss of points, disqualification of fish, angler, boat or team and refusal of entry to any future NSWGFA Interclub Tournaments. All competitors are reminded that as members of a Club they are regarded as representatives of that Club, as such, any unbecoming behaviour reflects adversely on that Club and indeed on all Game Fishers, hence, the Tournament Committee reserves the right to take any action it deems necessary in these circumstances. It is an expectation that all participants will conduct themselves in a responsible and courteous manner to Tournament Officials and other Competitors always throughout the Tournament. Penalties for misconduct may include disqualification from the Tournament.
- 3. PROTESTS any protest relative to a capture or tag & release must be submitted in writing by the Boat Captain to the Tournament Secretary. Protests MUST be lodged no later than 9.00 pm on the day of the incident concerned except last day which is 6pm. Note: the tournament committee has the right to act on any breach of any tournament rule whether a protest is lodged.
- **4. REQUEST FOR RECONSIDERATION** of a penalty imposed by the Tournament Committee must be submitted in writing by the Boat Captain to the Tournament Secretary no later than 8.00 pm on the day following the incident concerned.
- 5. ALL 2021 NSWGFA INTERCLUB TOURNAMENT DECISIONS AND RULINGS ARE FINAL AND BINDING ON ALL ENTRANTS.
- **6. AN ONLINE BRIEFING** will be held on Tuesday 23rd February 2021 at 7.00 pm. It is compulsory to register and verify the entry form as being correct.

- 7. NO REPLACEMENT OF BOATS AND COMPETITORS will be allowed after 31st January 2021. Anglers may not effect a capture or tag & release on any other vessel than the vessel he/she is registered on. Captured fish, tag & release card, the angler, all equipment used in the capture or tag must be presented to the weigh station on the vessel on which the capture or tag & release was effected and may not be transferred to another vessel however in the case of an emergency the Tournament Committee may at their discretion allow the transfer of an angler/fish and equipment used to affect the capture or tag.
- 8. SEAWORTHINESS OF BOATS All boats must comply with NSWRMS regulations for safety equipment and the safety standards of the vessel's home Club. A "Boat Safety Rescue form" is included as part of the entry form and must be completed and signed by the Boat Skipper. All boats must carry a 406 MHz EPIRB and have two working marine radios fitted one of which must be VHF frequency.
- 9. BOAT NUMBERS will be issued via email for the purpose of identifying your vessel during skeds.
- 10. STATUTORY REQUIREMENTS all boats must comply with NSWRMS regulations for safety equipment and the safety standards of the vessel's home club. All competitors are reminded of the requirement for a NSWDPI licence and bag limits when fishing.
- 11. FISHING DAYS & TIMES

Saturday 27th & Sunday 28th February 2021. On **Saturday 27th February** fishing will commence at 7.30am and finish 17.30pm. On **Sunday 28th February** starting time will be at 7.30am and finish 17.30pm, all captures, and tags must be received by 19.00pm on Sunday 28th February at the boats nominated port weigh station. Boats/Teams must log on to the radio operator from port they leave from with number on board. **Boats must nominate the port and boundaries they are fishing from on the entry form, once nominated no alteration is allowed. (Teams Must Fish from the same Port).**

- 12. LEAVING AND ENTERING THE PORT Boats/teams must Fish under their own club's rules when returning and leaving from port.
- 13. BAD WEATHER to avoid taking unnecessary risks in the event of bad weather the Tournament Committee will decide whether the day will be a competition day or not. Boats should establish early morning contact from 6.00am with Game Fish Base or members of the Tournament Committee at the weigh station. In the event of bad weather developing after the start of fishing then the NSWGFA President and the Interclub Tournament Committee will confer and decide whether the competition will be called off for the remainder of the day. All fish caught prior to this time will be eligible for the competition. Note: A declaration of a Gale Warning by the appropriate government weather authority requires the cancellation in the port and boundary nominated by the team to fish in. In the event of a declaration whilst vessels are at sea, such vessels are required to cease fishing immediately and return to port. Cancellation will only apply until the Gale Warning is Lifted. The Tournament Committee accepts no responsibility for decisions made by individuals whether to put to sea or not, having regard to the Committee's decision on the Tournament for the day. The ultimate decision on return to harbour remains with the competitors. It is requested that all boats display the appropriate capture and/or tag & release flags on return to port. Capture flags should be displayed on the port outrigger (when available) and tag & release flags on the starboard rigger below the sponsor's flag with the species flag underneath followed by the tag flags.
- **15. AWARDS** The 2021 NSWGFA Interclub Tournament Trophies and Awards are listed in schedule attached on page 6, and suitable mementos will be distributed at the NSWGFA AGM for clubs to present to the winners at their club for presentation. (photos to be sent to NSWGFA secretary if possible)

"C" FISHING RULES

The 2021 NSWGFA Interclub Tournament will be fished under the "Fishing Rules and Tackle Regulations" of the GFAA and NSWGFA as are in effect at the time. Note: The Tag & Release rules also are published by NSWGFA and will apply, in addition NSWGFA point scores, fishing rules and minimum weights will apply.

- 16. LINE CLASSES which will be recognised, are 4kg (no sharks), 6kg, 8kg, 10kg, 15kg, 24kg, 37kg and 60kg.
 - (a) CAPTURE Adult Angler MINIMUM WEIGHT TO QUALIFY
 - **(b) MARLIN** must weigh a minimum of 70kg on line class to 10kg and a minimum of 90kg on 15kg line class and over. Black, Blue & Striped Marlin
 - (c) YELLOWFIN TUNA & SOUTHERN BLUEFIN TUNA 15kg on line classes up to and including 15kg line, equal to line class for over 15kg line and for Junior Anglers equal to line class in all cases.
 - (d) SHARKS must weigh a minimum of 70kg on line class to 10kg and a minimum of 90kg on 15kg line class to 37kg and 130kg on 60kg line class. No points shall be awarded for shark captures on 4kg line class.
 - Blue, Smooth Hammerhead ONLY, Mako (all), Porbeagle, Thresher (all), Tiger, Whaler (all)
- (e) OTHER GAME FISH must weigh at least equal to the breaking strain of the line classused.
 - Sailfish, Shortbill Spearfish, Broadbill, Bigeye Tuna, Bluefin Tuna, Dogtooth Tuna, Longtail Tuna, Albacore, Wahoo, Spanish Mackerel, Yellowtail Kingfish, Cobia, Barracuda and Mahi Mahi
 - ** Junior Angler personal points only Striped Tuna & Kawa Kawa. Striped Tuna Catch & Release Only Same Points Apply

 SHARKS No Sharks will be weighed with restrictive device on jaws. Sewing up of shark jaws will automatically disqualify a capture. No shark will be weighed with a choker in place.
 - (f) MARLIN The use of identifiable Marlin carcasses is prohibited for use as tethered burley. Burley secured under floats is prohibited.

Junior and Small Fry Angler Minimum Weights

- (g) CAPTURE MINIMUM WEIGHT TO QUALIFY
- (h) MARLIN must weigh a minimum of 60kg on line class to 10kg and a minimum of 80kg on 15kg line class and over. Black, Blue & Striped Marlin
- (i) YELLOWFIN TUNA & SOUTHERN BLUEFIN TUNA Equal to line class in all cases.

- (j) SHARKS must weigh a minimum of 60kg on line class to 10kg and a minimum of 80kg on 15kg line class to 37kg and 120kg on 60kg line class. No points shall be awarded for shark captures on 4kg line class.

 Blue, Smooth Hammerhead ONLY, Mako (all), Porbeagle, Thresher (all), Tiger, Whaler (excluding oceanic White tip)
- (k) OTHER GAME FISH must weigh at least equal to the breaking strain of the line class used.
- Sailfish, Shortbill Spearfish, Broadbill, Bigeye Tuna, Bluefin Tuna, Dogtooth Tuna, Longtail Tuna, Albacore, Wahoo, Spanish Mackerel, Yellowtail Kingfish, Cobia, Barracuda and Mahi Mahi
 - ** Junior Angler personal points only Striped Tuna & Kawa Kawa. **Measure & Release Only Same Points Apply SHARKS No Sharks** will be weighed with restrictive device on jaws. Sewing up of shark jaws will automatically disqualify a capture. No shark will be weighed with a choker in place.
- (I) MARLIN The use of identifiable Marlin carcasses is prohibited for use as tethered burley. Burley secured under floats is prohibited.

THE METHOD OF RELEASING TAGGED FISH -The hook is to be removed or the leader cut as close as possible to the fish. A fish is considered tagged and released when tag is secured to the fish and the fish is released back into the water alive.

- (a) POINTS will be awarded as per NSWGFA Tag & Release point score.
- (b) CIRCLE HOOKS ONLY are permitted to be used for live baiting and trolling natural baits (whether live, dead, mutilated or dissected). Except in the case of targeting Narrow Barred Mackerel (Scomberomorus Commerson) NB: no points to be scored for any species caught while using live baits and/or trolling natural baits with "J"hooks.



CIRCLE HOOK DEFINITION: CIRCLE HOOK A hook with its point turned 90 degrees or less back towards the shank of the hook.

- (c) BILLFISH TAG all billfish must be tagged with the billfish tag; this is the only tag that will be recognised for billfish in this tournament. The billfish tag is for billfish only point score i.e. no other species.
- (d) ELIGIBLE SPECIES as per tag & release point score table Available on the NSWGFA Website.

 Blue, Smooth Hammerhead ONLY, Mako (all), Porbeagle, Thresher (all), Tiger, Great White, Whaler (excluding oceanic White tip)
- (e) LINE CLASS must be provided on tag & release forms and cards. If no line class is provided it will be deemed to have been caught on 60kg tackle.
- (f) **TIME** Failure to record time of release on the tag card will result in the time being recorded as at the end of the days fishing or after the last fish for the day has been tagged, whichever is the latter.

3. "D" OPERATIONS

- (a) **COMMUNICATIONS** radio schedules will be conducted as per the NSWGFA adopted "Guidelines for Radio Scheds" as are in affect at the time. Each zone will operate their own sked, depending on the port you fish from will determine the skeds you will be using. **Radio Schedules will be conducted every TWO hours**
- (b) Northern Zone Skeds (Port Stephens) Channel 80 first sked 8.10 then every 2 hours last sked 5.40pm
- (c) Northern Zone Skeds (Port Macquarie) TBD
- (d) Northern Zone Skeds (Coffs Harbour) TBD
- (e) Central zone Skeds TBD
- (f) Southern Zone TBD
- (g) Competitors are requested to advise "Radio Base" of the number of persons on board when they sign on by answering the first schedule. Boats will be called in numerical order, regardless of type of radio they have, and the Base will acknowledge each reply by repeating the report on both frequencies so that all competitors will be aware of all reports. Boats are to report on each schedule as follows: (i) Boat Number; (ii) Boat Name; (iii) Position (using grid map references); (iv) whether Trolling, Drifting or Anchored; (v) Accurate Fishing Report using the "000" system, i.e. Strikes, Hook-ups, Captures. If possible, boats are to give Species for Strikes and Hook-ups which are not landed. All boats are to report on every schedule. In the interests of safety, communication on each schedule is compulsory. Failure to answer two (2) consecutive radio schedules will incur a penalty – see page 5 – "F" Penalties. In the event of a boat suffering radio failure then they must contact another competing boat and have them advise Game Fish Base of the problem at the next schedule and immediately return to port. Boats must maintain RADIO SILENCE for 10 minutes before FINISH FISHING TIME to allow for reports of late hook-ups. On the 5.40pm schedule, boats are requested to advise Base of total tag and release or captures for the day. All boats are to sign off with "Game Fish Base" when they enter port at the end of the days fishing. If unable to make radio contact, then they must report to a Tournament Committee member at the weigh station before proceeding to their moorings/trailer. Failure to report on return to port will invoke a penalty – see page 5 – "F" Penalties. All boats are requested to avoid chatter on tournament frequencies. If competitors wish to talk to each other, please use another frequency and leave the tournament frequencies clear for safety and/or tournament business only. Inappropriate radio use is not only an offence under the Communications Act but will incur a penalty – see page 5 "F" – Penalties.
- (h) WEIGHSTATION CONTROL AND PROCEDURES Club Rules apply where fish are processed. Tackle to be checked.
- (i) CAPTURE and TAG & RELEASE DOCUMENTATION all captures and tag & release presented to the weigh station MUST be accompanied by correctly completed documentation. As per standard NSWGFA capture books, signed by authorised weigh master nominated prior to the event. Zone Chairman to email Capture certificates to the NSWGFA Secretary secretary@nswgfa.com.au.
- (j) **IDENTIFICATION OF SPECIES** in the event of any dispute regarding species of fish the decision of the Tournament Committee shall be final.
- (ii) SCIENTISTS It has been the practice of the Association to invite Research Scientists to the weigh station to gather measurements, weights and samples from fish weighed in. Anglers are requested to co-operate with these people and no other scientists.
- (iii) FISH STANDARD CLUB PORT RULES WILL APPLY. Fish may not be left at the weigh station, but must be taken by boat outside of the Marine Park and disposed of in an appropriate manner If a vessel is unable to safely dispose of a fish on the day of capture, the boat captain must seek direction on the appropriate course of action from the weigh master or designated authority and weighmaster at port vessel returns to. (Safety of the crew is paramount if the boat is incapable of disposing of the fish safely you must inform a tournament official to organise an alternative) Failure to comply with this rule and the direction given will disqualify the capture. Competitors must not clean or fillet fish or remove shark jaws near the weigh station, beaches, marinas or places frequented by the public. Fish carcasses must not be hung off boat's moorings, or marinas. If required, traces to be removed at the weigh station by or at the direction of a Tournament Committee member. Shark jaws to be removed on board boats only. Small boats to utilise larger boats if necessary. All boats must empty burley pots before entering the port. Penalties will be imposed for any breach of these rules see page 5 "F" Penalties In the event of any shark or marlin given away for eating, only the fillets may be given, and the remaining carcass is the responsibility of the skipper and crew.

- (k) SALE OF FISH Competitors are reminded that it is illegal for recreational or un-licensed anglers to sell their catches. The following rule has been adopted by the Association: "That any fish weighed for NSWGFA Trophies shall not be sold or bartered. Such fish shall be ineligible for any trophies or awards of the Association". Anyone found to have sold their catch will be disqualified from the tournament. BAG LIMITS All anglers must abide by the current NSW Government laws on bag limits.
- (I) MEDIA only media representatives accredited by NSWGFA and officially identifiable will be allowed access to the weigh stations. The NSWGFA logo, NSWGFA (name) or Official Tournament Name cannot be used in any media publication (including internet websites) without the express permission of the NSWGFA. Any breach of this rule can invoke a penalty

4. "F" PENALTIES

Note: Penalties WILL APPLY to BOTH Capture and Tag & Release Points

- (a) MISCONDUCT Penalties at the discretion of the Tournament Committee see "B" Tournament Rules Rule2.
- (b) FAILURE TO SIGN OFF ONRETURN TO PORT loss of 10,000 capture & 10,000 tag & release points see "B" Tournament Rules see Rule 12 & "D" Operations Rule (a).
- (c) FAILURE TO ANSWER TWO (2) CONSECTUTIVE RADIO SCHEDULES & INAPPROPRIATE RADIO USAGE loss of 10,000 capture & 10,000 tag & release points see "D" Operations Rule (a).
- (d) FISH DISPOSAL Failure to comply with this rule and the direction given will disqualify the fish see "d" Operations Rule (j) (iii)
- (e) DISCHARGE OF WASTE OR RUBBISH Non-compliance with current NSWRMS regulations will attract a loss of 2,000 capture and 2,000 tag & release points.
- (f) SALE OF FISH disqualification from tournament see f Operations
- (g) BREACH OF MEDIA RULE Penalties at the discretion of the Tournament Committee see g Operations Notwithstanding the above penalties, the Tournament Committee reserves the right in any circumstance to disqualify any capture, angler or boat for disregarding any 2021 NSWGFA Interclub Tournament rule or instruct
